



ANNOUNCING THE COLORAIL WINTER MEETING

Amtrak's passenger service in Colorado and ColoRail's priorities for 2012 including the successful renovation of Denver Union Station will be the topics of the next ColoRail General Meeting to be held in Denver, Saturday, February 25th from 9:30 a.m. until 1:00 p.m. at the Central Denver Presbyterian Church. The church is located at 1660 Sherman Street.

Noted Colorado film maker Rich Luckin will show *Amtrak – the First Forty Years* which commemorates the anniversary of the nation's passenger rail system. Rich will discuss the development and production of the film.

We have also talked to Denver Union Station developer Dana Crawford and invited her to attend the meeting to discuss current development plans. She is very interested in our views on the transportation and historical elements of the station.

Mark Imhoff, CDOT Transit and Rail Division Director will join us to introduce David Krutsinger, the new rail program manager. Mr. Krutsinger will discuss the soon to be released state rail plan.

Rounding out the meeting will be a brief summary of ColoRail's priorities which include:

- Helping with the successful completion of Denver Union Station, particularly the passenger and historic elements
- Supporting passage of the Regional Transportation District's financing package if they decide to put it on the ballot
- Continuation of Amtrak's Southwest Chief in Colorado
- Advancing commuter rail along the front range, particularly the I-25 North corridor where the Environmental Impact Statement is complete
- Supporting the successful completion of the state rail plan

The Central Denver Presbyterian Church is a short walk from the Mall Shuttle at 16th and Broadway. It is also near RTD bus routes 20 and 15/15 limited. For motorists, metered street parking is available on Sherman and a pay lot is located across the street from the Church.

Election of four board members will also be conducted.
